KUT-WUT BRATAUALUNG OFFSHORE WIND PROJECT


Kut-Wut Brataualung would harness the 'roaring forties' winds in Bass Strait to supply up to 2.2 GW of reliable renewable energy - enough to power around 1.2 million homes.

The project is proposed in a 689 km² area, 45 km off the Gippsland coast.

We expect to start investigating the wind, waves, seabed and local environment in this area from late 2025, under a feasibility licence granted by the Australian Government in May 2024.

If feasible, we will seek further approvals for the project to proceed to construction in the 2030s, to support Victoria's energy needs as Latrobe Valley power stations retire.

Kut-Wut Brataualung was named in consultation with the Gunaikurnai Land and Waters Corporation (GLaWAC) recognising a family group of the Brataualung peoples that lived in and around the Toora area.

Feasibility studies

The first step in planning an offshore wind project is to study the site and local conditions.

We'll start with wind and wave monitoring, followed by multiple years of marine environment surveys to build our understanding of local species and conditions, and seabed studies.

We'll also look at options for where and how this project could best connect to the grid.

Consultation

We believe that involving local people from the very beginning makes projects better.

At each stage of Kut-Wut Brataualung's development we'll seek out local knowledge and expertise to help plan feasibility studies, shape the project, and build an industry that delivers for Gippsland, Victoria and Australia. Our local team is always available to hear ideas and feedback.
